# MATERIALS STANCE

The Coalition agreed that **biosolids** in fertilizer are not tolerated, no question. On **natural "weed and feed"** corn gluten product,

- The coalition agreed that corn gluten products, provided they're not mixed with anything toxic or fast release, are consistent with our values & pesticide-free mantra.
- Question is do support reference to corn gluten products mixed with other additives as a "non-toxic weed and feed" or find a different way to refer to the product? Several groups and allies are already using the "weed and feed" analogy. Some feel the "weed and feed" term draws in the lay person and could move more toward natural products, others feel strongly that the reference could send a blurry message, confuse the public when purchasing products, encourage over-fertilization (not realizing that they're fertilizing with nitrogen), and that since it's not an actual herbicide + fertilizer then technically it's an incorrect analogy.

Confronting local store managers with request for natural products is encouraged on behalf of local groups or individuals not on behalf of Coalition as it could muddle any negotiations with headquarters.

#### **COALITION STATUS**

AS OF 4/28/05: 135 sign-ons to the Declaration. Appears that all signers also choose to join the coalition.

Coalition agreed that it would be good to have a set monthly time/day for conf calls. Also agreed that the current structure of decision-making is adequate and no additional process is needed at this time. Agreed that inactive members of the steering committee should be asked to join the greater coalition to free up room for suggestions of other active steering members.

## AROUND THE COUNTRY UPDATES

**Westchester, NY (Patti):** Pesticide-Free Day, May 7, 2005 by county pest management committee. Advertising, why not to use p's on lawn. This year county exec doing a phone message about haz drop off day/p-free day. Requesting papers do full page PSAs. Also, April issue front page of *Landscaper, The Voice Of The Industry* features GHLP & Westchester program. GHLP's landscaper how-to video really turned things around – great for getting landscapers to see possibilities.

**New Jersey (Jane):** State press release highlighted regional activities, educational campaigns & p-free lawns and subsequent day featured Chatham p-free park. Beyond getting press out of it, the release helped getting the buzz going around the state.

Marin, CA (Ginger): GHLP video being used in Calif going to landscape companies one by one.

**Michigan (Tess):** Meeting with two large landscaper orgs (could use video!) about new p-free lawn campaign. Discussing why they should be considering alternatives. Presenting in mid-May. 1 hour. Building a small coalition, also mtg with mi Dept of Ag & legislators.

Connecticut (Kim): NOFA is having a one-day training course in August on organic lawn care.
