CCOF thanks the National Organic Standards Board (NOSB) for the opportunity to comment on the Livestock Committee's proposal regarding the Petitioned Synthetic Amino Acids for Pet Foods. We support the committee's proposal to allow inclusion of taurine for cats, and the recommendation to reject the other petitioned synthetic amino acids.

CCOF supports availability of organic pet food. We believe it creates an important market for secondary meat and grain products that might otherwise be wasted. Organic pet food must be able to support the nutritional needs of the animals, and we support the NOSB deferring to the Association of American Feed Control Officials (AAFCO) to make the determination of nutritional requirements.
