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Public Schools - Integrated Pest Management

FOR the purpose of extending the applicability of the integrated pest management 3

systems adopted by the county boards of education to certain areas at public 4

5 schools; providing for certain types of notice to be given before the application of

pesticides on school grounds under certain circumstances; requiring the 6

7 Department of Agriculture to develop certain standards and criteria by a certain

8 date; requiring county boards to develop and implement certain integrated pest

management systems for school grounds by a certain date; requiring the 9

10 Department, in consultation with the Maryland Association of Boards of

Education, to submit a certain report to the General Assembly by a certain date; 11

making stylistic changes; providing for a delayed effective date; and generally 12

13 relating to pesticide application in public schools.

AND IT BE FURTHER ENACTED, That the Department of 24 Agriculture, in consultation with the Maryland Association of Boards of Education, 25 shall report to the General Assembly, in accordance with § 2-1246 of the State 26 Government Article, by January 1, 2000 on: (a) the status of the Department's 27 development of uniform criteria and standards for integrated pest management 28 systems for school grounds; (b) the status of implementation of integrated pest 29 management systems for school grounds for the 2001 school year; (c) the 30 implementation of interior integrated pest management systems by schools; and (d) the 31 participation level of parents, guardians, and staff in the pesticide notification list 32 required under subsection (i) of § 5-208.1 of the Agriculture Article.
